From the Editor . . .

The interest in publication of a journal at the University of Denver has been sustained through three years of work by both students and faculty and by members of the Denver community. While the students involved assumed the *Journal's* continued viability it is reassuring to have tangible proof in Volume 2, No. 1. That realization has come from many sources but the *Journal* owes a special debt to members of the Denver community who are serving on the *Journal's* Advisory Board. Since its inception in 1969 the *Journal* has been able to rely on the community for continuous encouragement and support. The members of the Advisory Board are listed in the *Journal* and I will not name them individually here. It is hardly a sufficient expression, but for their effort and support we are deeply grateful.

The impetus behind the *Journal* was the development of a relationship between international law and other disciplines which affect and interact with international law. A prime focus of this development is on innovative and challenging ideas. A purpose of this *Journal* is to create an open forum to present such ideas in a legal publication. The only qualifications we have placed on the exposition of such ideas are those of current interest and a degree of feasibility.

The current issue of the *Journal* contains articles which offer such worthwhile suggestions, ideas, and proposals. We hope that some of those will present a stimulus for further thought and response. The fall issue of the *Journal* will contain a forum section devoted specifically to reactions to *Journal* articles and developments in the international field. We would welcome your comments.

There are three areas of focus in this issue: student input; social science input; and the input of those working with various applications of international law. The *Journal* feels fortunate to have student material that merits publication. One of the articles was written by an expert engineer who has recently received his degree in law and the other by two involved students. We find them stimulating and hope that their publication will encourage further student writing.

The second area of focus is that of the social sciences. Those who are knowledgeable in other disciplines can often give lawyers important and necessary tools with which to solve legal

and law-related problems. In this issue aspects of economics and political science are explored.

~ A third area is the exposure to the infinite variety of ideas of those who are attempting to implement international law. The scope of these ideas can be extremely broad or very narrow, diffuse or specialized. But despite the variety of the approaches taken they all have as a common goal the development of international law. Those of us who are students or interested observers have perhaps the most to gain from these contributors. For it is in their continued efforts to find effective implementation of such ideas that international legal rights are developed and extended.

Politicide, Human Rights, River Pollution, Legitimization, and Economic Impact of Current Policies are the topical headings of the issue. They represent a cross section of what we feel are important and significant topics to be discussed and explored. The Fall issue of the *Journal* will be a symposium issue focusing on expropriation and its legal and political implications. Again, we welcome your comments as they relate to this topic.
