This issue represents the first instance in which the *Journal* has focused on one particular topic which was felt to be of practical value to the legal and business communities. We anticipate that future issues will continue to reflect our concern to provide stimulating and informative material which will prove useful. The Proceedings of the 7th Annual Regional Conference of the American Society of International Law hosted by the University of Denver College of Law introduce the Symposium section. The article by Professor William Loehr, of the University of Denver Graduate School of International Studies, discusses economic issues involved in recent Latin American expropriations. Henry Landau, Esquire, of Simpson, Thacher and Bartlett, of New York City, presents the view that expropriation portends grave financial problems for both the international investor and the host countries. The article by Professor Clive M. Schmitthoff, Editor of the *Journal of Business Law*, discusses theoretical concepts underlying the whole area of expropriation. The student comment which concludes the Symposium section analyzes the recent Iraqi expropriation as an example of the present status of the law of expropriation.

The material following the Symposium deals with topics of general interest. James A.R. Nafziger, Esquire, Administrative Director of the American Society of International Law, describes the role of the International Council of Museums in controlling the traffic of stolen art objects. Bernard Frank, Esquire, of Frank and Frank, Allentown, Pennsylvania, analyzes the application of the ombudsman system to Tanzania, and concludes that it is a useful governmental institution for developing countries. Professor John N. Hazard, of the Columbia University School of Law, comments on the necessity for law reviews to relate to contemporary issues to realize their intellectual goals.

Our appreciation for the extensive support which has been given the *Journal* must also be expressed. Mr. Ed V. Goodin, Mr. John A. Moore, Mr. Donald Hoagland and Mr. John Betz, the alumni, and so many others have continually encouraged and stimulated our activities. Dean Robert B.
